She specializes in women's issues, environmental issues and interfaith dialogue. Her sustained concern for environmental/food ethics is the subject of her dissertation research.

An ordained minister of GMIM (Gereja Masehi Injili di Minahasa), the Christian Evangelical Church in Minahasa, she is also on the Faculty of Theology at Universitas Kristen Indonesia Tomohon, and a PhD student at the Indonesian Consortium for Religious Studies (ICRS),

RELIGION IN INDONESIA

Indonesia is officially a presidential republic and a unitary state without an established state religion. It officially recognizes the largest six religions and more recently has extended recognition to many minor religions. It has the world's largest Muslim population - over 86% of the population (99% of them Sunni).

Several different religions are practiced in the country: Approximately 10.7% identify as Christian (70% of them Protestant, 29% Catholic), followed by Hindu, Buddhist, Confucian, and others.

- 17,000 islands, including Sumatra, Java, Sulawesi parts of Borneo and New Guinea
- 4th most populous country in the world with 280 million people
- Capital is Jakarta on Java home to 10.5 million people (metro area - 32 million)
- Vast areas of wilderness support one of the world's highest levels of biodiversity
- Diverse population 1300+ native ethnic groups, 700+ languages
- Straddles the equator tropical climate
- On the Pacific "Ring of Fire", with earthquakes, tsunamis, and 400 volcanoes - 130 active, incl. Krakatoa
